We are glad you are with us today!




The Epistle Romans 5:1-5

The Nicene Creed BCP 358

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father.

Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven:

by the power of the Holy Spirit

he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,

who proceeds from the Father and the Son.

We pray for Justin, Archbishop of Canterbury; Michael, our Presiding Bishop; Terry, our Bishop; Lee, our Priest; and for all bishops, priests, and deacons; *That they may be faithful ministers of your Word and Sacraments*.

We pray for Donald, our President; Matthew and Eric, our Governors; Greg, our Mayor; and for all who govern and hold authority in the nations of the world;

That there may be justice and peace on the earth.

We commend to your gracious care and keeping the men and women of our armed forces, and others in the service of our government, at home and abroad;

Defend them day by day with your heavenly grace; and grant them a sense of your abiding presence wherever they may be.

Give us grace to do your will in all that we undertake;

That our works may find favor in your sight.

Have compassion on all Christians who suffer persecution; our guests of the food and clothing ministry; those affected by war, disaster, and tragedy throughout the world; and all those who suffer from any grief or trouble.

That they may be delivered from their distress.

Give to all the departed eternal rest;

Let light perpetual shine upon them.

We praise you for your saints who have entered into joy;

May we also come to share in your heavenly kingdom.

Let us pray for our own needs, for those of others. and for those who have been commended to our prayers.

Silence is kept for a time as the people add their own petitions silently or aloud.

The Celebrant says

Silence.

Minister and People

Most merciful God,
we confess that we have sinned against you
in thought, word, and deed,
by what we have done,
and by what we have left undone.
We have not loved you with our whole heart;
we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.

The Priest stands and says

Almighty God have mercy on you, forgive you all your sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen you in all goodness, and by the power of the Holy Spirit keep you in eternal life. Amen.

#### The Peace

All stand. The Celebrant says to the people

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People And also with you.

Then the Ministers and the People may greet one another in the name of the Lord.

The people sit.

#### Greeting, Announcements, and recognitions

Those with birthdays, those graduating from high school or university, and those with other achievements are asked to come forward and be recognized.

The Celebrant then says

Let us pray.

Celebrant and Congregation together

For birthdays and anniversaries:

O God, our times are in your hand: Look with favor, we pray, on your servant(s) as *they* begin(s) another year. Grant that *they* may grow in wisdom and grace, and strengthen *their* trust in your goodness all the days of *their* life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

#### Music Notes

**Sir John Stainer** sang in the choir at St. Paul's Cathedral from age seven to sixteen where he later succeeded Goss as organist. He was appointed Professor of Music at Oxford and wrote textbooks on harmony and the organ. His most well-known work is *The Crucifixion* from which his famous setting *God so loved the world* comes. **I saw the Lord** is a large double choir anthem intended for the acoustics of St. Paul's Cathedral. The writing is dramatic with big build ups and occasional antiphonal writing. In the later section, things calm down with a quartet of singers accompanied periodically by the chorus. It ends with a rich full choir sound.

**Sergei Rachmaninov** was a Russian composer and virtuoso pianist. Some of his most famous works are his 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> piano concertos. He spent quite a bit of time playing in the United States during his life. His composition style remained conservative for the early Twentieth Century, still writing very much in a late Romantic style. This was something for which he was criticized during

his life, but now seems to have earned him a seat of honor in the repertory of Classical music. **The Cherubic Hymn** is a rich 8-part setting used in the Divine Liturgy of the Eastern Orthodox Church. It portrays the song of the Cherubim praising God in Trinitarian form. Rachmaninov's music is exhilarating and sublime, and every now and then you may hear a hint of magnificent church bells coming through the music.
